Lake water related matters: Water testing, clarity, depth and boat washing.

Water testing

Water testing was completed on July 7th and September 13th this year at 30 standardized sites around the entire lake for e-coli levels. The results of all tests are presented in the graph on this page measured in e-coli particles per 100 ml of water. Quebec guideline for safe swimming water is 200 particles per 100 ml while Ontario's is 100 particles per 100 ml. You will see that the results at all sites tested in both spring and fall were well below these guidelines.

Safety buoys

We have now replaced 16 of the 20 buoys on the lake. The remaining 4 will be replaced in the spring of 2021 prior to the May long weekend. Please be sure to remain at least 30 meters away from all buoys when boating on the lake. The buoys are anchored down with cinder blocks however a large wake from a boat driving too close can easily dislodge the buoy and move it away from the rock it was intended to warn boaters about – resulting in a dangerous situation.

Water levels

The graph below compares weekly water level measurements taken from the same spot on the lake over the past five years. Several factors impact water levels including winter melt, amount of rainfall and heat intensity. A big thank you to Kevin Scott and Chantal Vaillancourt who manage this process on behalf of the Lake Association.


Boat washing

The boat washing station was available for free the entire boating season in the parking lot of the Community Centre in East Aldfield across the street from the P'tit magasin général. Approximately 25 boats were washed this year at the station. It is very important that all boats, trailers and other vessels that have been exposed to other bodies of water (other than Lake Sinclair) are thoroughly washed prior to being put back into the lake. Foreign invasive species are very prevalent in surrounding lakes and rivers and are easily transported to other bodies of water causing irreparable harm in many cases. There is no charge for using the boat wash and it only takes a few minutes to do. Be sure to pass this info on to your guests who may bring a boat or other water vessel with them when visiting.



Soap products Reminder

It is recommended to use products with a formula biodegradable in less than 30 days such as La Parisienne, BioVert and Attitude. These products are phosphate free. Phosphorus containing products increase the level of chlorophyll in the lake which in turn leads to increased algae and plant growth and reduced oxygen levels for fish.








Lac Sinclair - Water Level and eColi




Lac Sinclair - eColi



A New Internet Service Coming Soon?

Many of us spent more time living and working at the cottage this summer and noticed the stark difference between the internet service that we get in town vs. what we get at the lake. The two current options are Xplornet, a satellite-based service, and Digicom, a fixed wireless service.

There may soon be a third option available to Canadians in remote locations. Starlink is a new satellite-based service being deployed by SpaceX that promises faster and hopefully cheaper internet service.

Traditional satellite internet services come from large satellites in a geostationary earth orbit (GEO). GEO satellites are always at the same fixed point in space, about 35,000 KM above earth over the equator. Your Xplornet dish is pointed at either ViaSat-1 which is over the pacific off the western coast of South America or ViaSat-2 which is over northern Brazil.


Starlink is planning to launch thousands of small satellites that will be orbiting the globe at a high speed and at an altitude of about 550 km. These low earth orbit (LEO) satellite constellations, by being closer to earth and by distributing the load over thousands of satellites and dozens of base stations, result in lower latency and faster speeds. Another benefit of a LEO system is that your dish will be pointing much higher in the sky and it might be easier to get a line of sight if trees or hills are a current problem.

Starlink is currently in a beta test phase and early data shows download speeds of up to 150 mpbs and upload speeds of around 20 mpbs with latency of 20ms to 40ms. There is no information yet available on final pricing plans, hardware costs or most importantly on data transfer limits.



Battery Backup Power

This Thanksgiving weekend we had yet another power outage that lasted several hours. Small electronics like modems, wifi access points, and cell phone boosters use very little power and can be run from battery backup units for several minutes to a couple hours depending on the size of the battery and load of your electronics. A 1500 volt-amperes UPC which will power your modem for at least 2-3 hours goes for about \$200. No need to fire up the noisy generator.



Fresh Water Jellyfish

While canoeing with my daughter and grand daughter in mid-August we saw small jellyfish just under the surface in deep, calm water near "Gull Island". There is good information about this non-dangerous creature in a text from our website: http://lacsinclair.ca/en/environment

In September 2007 freshwater jellyfish were found in Lake Sinclair. This variety of jellyfish is not considered dangerous to humans since we have no hard evidence that these organisms can penetrate the human skin.

They are about the size of a quarter when fully grown (20-25 mm in diameter). They are umbrella shaped and have a whorl of string-like tentacles around their circular edge (ring canal). Each tentacle contains hundreds of special cells called cnidocytes. These cnidocytes contain the nematocytes that are used to capture a prey. These jellyfish are usually translucent with a whitish or greenish tinge. Often, large flat sex organs called gonads hang from the underside of the jellyfish. These organs make the jellyfish easier to spot because they are not translucent.

The freshwater jellyfish, called Craspedacusta sowerbii, is not a true jellyfish like some of its salt water relatives. The C. sowerbii differs slightly from the true marine jellyfish in the fact that it has a structure called velum on the ventral surface. This thin, shelf-like membranous structure extends inward from the circular edge (ring canal) of the bell. The manubrium, which ends in a mouth, extends down through a hole in the velum. The velum is the structure that sets C. sowerbii apart from the true jellyfish and is the reason why it belongs to the class Hydrozoa which includes the more common hydra. Therefore C.sowerbii is a hydra, but because it looks like a jellyfish, we call it a jellyfish.





This jellyfish is most often found in calm water. It prefers standing water rather than currents. It feeds on tiny, microscopic animals called zooplankton: using its cnidocytes the jellyfish injects into its prey a paralyzing substance. It can also feed on macroinvertebrates and even on small fish. Living in colonies of 40 to 50 members, we can mostly see them at the end of summer when the water of the lake is warm. Usually August and September are peak months for jellyfish sighting because lake water is warm and food is abundant. Jellyfish will be floating or swimming gently just below the surface of the water. Sometimes it will reveal its presence by disturbing the surface of the water when it comes to the surface. In our region Danford, Cayamant, Gauvreau, des Loups, L'Escalier and Leslie lakes have already acknowledged the presence of this jellyfish.

Lac Sinclair Association Annual General Meeting Minutes

Saturday, September 12, 2020 at 10am Ste-Sophie d'Aldfield Community Centre

- Opening of the meeting and establishment of quorum.
 members were present including the following executive members (Jocelyne Alain, David Hallman, Colin Chesterman, Mark Farrell, Megan Farrell, Luc Vézina and Chantal Vaillancourt). Special guests: Federal MP Will Amos and Francis Beausoleil Coordinator for MP.
- 2. Introduction of the guests and Executive Committee
 The President introduced all committee members, special guests MP Will Amos and
 Francis Beausoleil, as well as our volunteers: Yvon Prégent and Louise Bellefeuille.
- 3. Adoption of the Agenda Moved by Josette Vaillancourt and seconded by Corinne Smith
- 4. Adoption of the July 6, 2019 AGM minutes Moved by John Earl and seconded by Patrick Rollin.
- 5. Adoption of the 2019 Financial Report
 Colin Chesterman presented the 2019 Financial Statements which were verified by
 Roger Smith. The majority of the revenues come from the memberships,
 advertisements (thanks to the President for all her work on this) and the municipal
 grants (with the exception of one grant from La Pêche which will show in the 2020
 statement as the grant was received in January 2020). Main expenditures come from
 the expenses for boat washing, water testing and recently the replacement of buoys.
 Adoption of the report was moved by Yvon Prégent and seconded by Mark Palmer.
- 6. 2020 President's Report

I am now in my third year as president and continue to enjoy it very much. This summer has proven to be particularly busy with the great weather and more people spending time at the lake instead of travelling, owing to COVID-19 restrictions.

- We held 2 executive committee meetings: one on October 26, 2019 and one on May 9, 2020.
- ➤ We published 2 newsletters: Fall 2019 newsletter published mid-December 2019 and the Spring 2020 newsletter published mid-June 2020.
- Last July 11, 2020 I, representing Lac Sinclair, held a meeting with 8 other lake associations: Lake Lola, Lake Ricard, Lake Teeples, Lake Gauvreau, Lake Bernard, Lac des Loups (Wolf's Lake), Lake Mahon and Lake Notre-Dame again to share common problems but specifically to talk about the situation with invasive aquatic plants. This was our second meeting but this time with more than double the attendance of lake associations. The plan is to create an Association of lake associations as it existed before, more than 10 years ago.

- ➤ We have revamped our Website with the great help of Ophelia, the daughter of our web master Luc Vézina. I will let him talk to you more about it as we continue with the Agenda.
- My colleague Mark, my spouse and I did a great clean-up of Île aux moutons. as some of you may know, there was camping on the island, about 4 campfire sites, a lot of traffic and a lot of garbage. We have installed two "No Camp Fire signs", two additional "Pick up your Garbage" signs provided to us by the Ministère de l'énergie et des ressources naturelles (MERN) in addition to the two already in place, and a big Lake Sinclair Association sign.
- ➤ We had a great the fishing tournament last August 2 and even though it was rainy and had COVID-19 restrictions in place, participation was great; close to 60 people participated including 18 children from the ages of 4 to 12.
- And lastly, I am currently working with both the MRC des collines Police and the Sûreté du Québec so they can each patrol our lake at least once a summer. They were so busy this summer, unlike any other summer before, that they were unable to patrol our lake this year.

All this information will be published in our Fall 2020 Newsletter.

Finally, I would like to remind everyone that all our work is entirely done on a voluntary basis; I want to thank all of the volunteers very much for their continued work.

7. Information Section of the AGM William Amos, Federal MP, Pontiac County

Jocelyne Alain introduced the Federal MP William Amos, and Francis Beausoleil, Coordinator for MP Amos and Ward 3 ("downtown Masham") Councillor for the Municipality of La Pêche.

Jocelyne invited MP Will Amos to talk to us about the lack of cell service in our area.

Mr. Amos noted that his top infrastructure priority is cell/internet coverage for rural areas. He explained that he is the only MP to bring a motion to the last Parliament regarding the implementation of a digital infrastructure for rural Canada. The motion was approved unanimously across all parties. He emphasized that this is a difficult and expensive problem to solve and cover for all rural Canada.

He explained that back in the 1990's the government privatized the digital infrastructure initiatives, and while a lot of progress was made, little or no focus was put on the rural sections of the country as they were not considered profitable sectors. The government then announced a subsidy program "Connect to Innovate" in 2018. This program's focus was on internet services and not cell services. The government created a map of Canada which highlighted the areas where there is inadequate coverage. Telecom companies and municipalities were invited to present proposals to the government. The budget for this program was \$500 M, and although some rural areas saw improvements, the focus was again put on profitable areas and most of the rural communities did not get any service. Over \$20M of these funds were given to projects for the Pontiac riding. Bell Canada received the most of this funding with implementation starting in 2021.

Mr. Amos noted that the government will be making an announcement in the Fall for a \$1B investment for the digital infrastructure for rural Canada. He explained that, in order to obtain cell phone coverage Municipalities in collaboration with Telco companies would need to propose a project specific to our area.

Mr. Amos informed us that the Municipality of La Pêche has a volunteer (Pablo Sanchez) uniquely focused on the digital infrastructure. Mr. Sanchez is a digital expert in networks and programming. This has enabled the Municipality to inform all telecommunication providers about the digital gaps in our community as the data is quite detailed and precise. Mr. Amos introduced Francis Beausoleil to elaborate more on this initiative.

Mr. Beausoleil informed us that the Municipality will not be building any network/infrastructure as they do not have the expertise or funds for such a massive project. The municipality with the help of their volunteer are working on providing data which includes a detailed map of the areas that do not have any digital service. At this time, the Municipality is working with Cogeco as they have developed a particularly good working relationship. On the internet side of this issue, the municipality discovered that the closed schools in Lac des Loups and Farrellton are connected to fibre optic cable which had been funded by the school board. The municipality purchased the network from the board. They have informed the Telco companies that they are willing to rent the network to them, which would reduce the amount of construction required. Mr. Beausoleil concluded that this is a priority for the Municipality of La Pêche and they are continuing to work diligently to address the digital infrastructure issue for our communities.

Mr. Amos thanked us for inviting him to our meeting and reiterated that the key to getting cell coverage is is to have local governance work with telecoms in presenting project proposals to the federal government.

8. Active Association Files

Activities: Jocelyne Alain provided feedback from the Coordinator, Brian LeConte regarding the Fishing Tournament. Despite the sketchy weather, the tournament went very well. The registration and payment online in advance really helped in

making the tournament run smoothly. She particularly thanked Brian for organizing the tournament and Colin and David for helping out that day.

Jocelyne requested volunteers to bring back the regatta. David Hallman and Megan Farrell provided a background for this event. The biggest challenge is finding a location for this activity. Jocelyne has a person who would be willing to help with the event. Megan Farrell will assist in re-introducing the Regatta if she is able to get two partners to help her. Mark Farrell has a potential location, which will be further investigated. Corinne Smith has also volunteered to help in organizing as well as Josette Vaillancourt and Chantal Vaillancourt.

Water Testing: Mark Farrell presented the information on water testing which includes measuring e. coli levels. In the past, testing was done with 25 samples, but because of the addition of more cottages on the east side of the lake, they added 5 more samples this year for a total of 30. This year there were 3 spots that had high levels of E.coli in the spring, 2 of which are quite high in the far north-west side of the lake. After the Fall testing, if the levels of e. coli are still high, they will have to investigate as to the possible causes. Overall, the rest of the results were very good. Mark also presented the water clarity processes and results which have been excellent. Results of the water levels were also presented. Levels are quite low this year, due to an extremely dry and hot summer.

Jocelyne Alain provided-information regarding the potential impact of the beaver dams: low water flow in the ruisseau downstream from the dam which diminishes the amount of water for the dry hydrant available to fight fires – the hydrant is located where the ruisseau passes under Ch. Simon; and high water in the lake which could undercut the shoreline in several places, including where Chemin du Lac Sinclair passes close to the shore. The Municipality of Low has sent letters to the property owners where these dams are located to have them take action to remove the dam. To <u>install pipes to allow better water flow</u> in order not to destroy the dams was not an option because it requires a minimum of two feet of water.

Buoys: Mark Farrell informed us that all old buoys will be replaced by next year. It was also noted that the wakes from boats (especially wake boats) often displace the buoys, so flexible cables have been added to try and address this issue. Boats should stay at least 30 meters away from the buoys.

Mark also re-iterated the importance of having all water toys, boats, trailers and vehicle undercarriages washed prior to launching, to ensure we do not introduce any invasive species in our lake.

New Website/Facebook: Luc Vézina provided an update on the Association's website. The website was upgraded using WordPress, which is a free content management system, therefore no cost to the association other than labour. It will now have a mobile view. A sponsor page has also been added. There has been more activity on the Facebook page, and there is now a Lac Sinclair group that cottage owners can join.

9. Other Business

Mark Farrell suggests that we promote the use of life jackets, as it was noticed that quite a few people while using their personal watercraft were not wearing them. It was decided that a reminder of boat and water safety would be added to the newsletter.

10. Election of new members of the Executive Committee for 2020-2021

The Chair of the Nominating Committee, David Hallman, advised that all current members of the Executive Committee are willing to serve another year. David proposed that Chantal Vaillancourt be voted in as secretary. The motion was carried.

11. Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 11:45am.
